Our phenomenal staff reached 58,319 people, 12,775 through direct services, across seven programs, and 45,544 via prevention education and community outreach. All of our essential services were implemented 24-hours daily,



seven days a week. We provided 9,622 nights of emergency shelter and 28,866 meals to adults and children fleeing the horrors of domestic violence, while also manning three emergency hotlines in our Sexual Assault Services Center, Adult Protective Services and Groundwork programs. We advanced our mission to provide diverse services that inspire people to improve the quality of their lives in their greatest time of need. Guardian Angel Community Services commemorated milestone anniversaries, celebrated accomplishments and gathered for many memorable awareness events and fundraisers. Every year during October: Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM), GACS participates in many awareness events and activities. October 2022 was no exception! We had a successful awareness month, hosting and participating in a variety of events including: Grundy County Take Back the Night, Will County Take Back the Night, Witches Night Out, and our Angels Against Abuse 5K.

This past fall, we kicked off the month of October in Grundy County, where the agency operates a satellite office in Morris, IL. "Grundy County Take Back The Night" is a free event, organized by our Groundwork Program and held annually at the Grundy County Court House. This year's kickoff took place on October

5th and included keynote speaker, Kim Jensen, who's daughter, Elizabeth Link tragically lost her life due to domestic violence. The event concluded with a luminary walk to Gebhard Brewery where the Morris Women's Club provided refreshments.

The 12th Annual Angels Against Abuse 5K Walk & Run was held on October 8, 2022. The event was hosted by Guardian Angel's Groundwork and Suzy's Caring Place programs for victims of domestic violence. A keynote speech was given by longtime GACS supporter, Will County State's Attorney, James W. Glasgow. Additional funds were raised through raffle baskets, ticket sales, and generous donations from our community supporters. GACS is eternally grateful to all of those who show their support to the agency, especially by attending or otherwise supporting our awareness events. Witches Night Out is a costume fundraiser for women who want to make a difference in another woman's life. Proceeds go to Will County Agencies serving women & children. The agencies selected provide services and support that help women secure their independence, regain their dignity, and become self-sufficient (www. witchesnightout.com). The event is held annually at the Jacob Henry Mansion (Joliet) and has continued to grow in popularity, year after year, with tickets selling out in record time. Additionally, Guardian Angel staff serve on the committee and volunteer every year as the "gatekeepers" and scan thousands of tickets for attendees, as they arrive. GACS was so thankful to, again, have been selected as a recipient of proceeds from the 2023 event.

On Thursday October 20, 2022 the 23rd annual Will County Take Back the Night (TBTN) event was held at Joliet Central High School. The event was free to the public and included resource tables, a vigil honoring lives lost to domestic violence in Will county, and a march in the surrounding area. Annually, TBTN brings survivors, supporters, activists and community leaders together in a call to end violence. The 2022 event featured speaker Eden Strong, who is a local survivor of domestic violence and the founder of Rise From The Ashes, a nonprofit assisting financially struggling victims of domestic violence in legally separating from abusers through the civil court process. Recap of April: Sexual Assault Awareness Month 2023

April, recognized nationally as Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM), was highlighted by numerous awareness and activities hosted and attended by our Sexual Assault Service Center (SASC). 2023 marked the first year that the program was able to resume in-person events since 2019. A music-themed event, "Songs for Survivors" was held on April 14 at Double J's Bar and Grill. The event featured music by former SASC staff member, Janice Masokas and her husband Mike (Full Circle Acoustic) with a special guest appearance by their daughter, Sammy Jo. The Masokas family is so talented and we are grateful they share their gift with us. Funds were raised through a split the pot and raffle.

Denim Day was celebrated on April 26. For the past 24 years, Peace Over Violence has run its Denim Day campaign on a Wednesday in April in honor of Sexual Violence Awareness Month. The campaign was originally triggered by a ruling by the Italian Supreme Court where a rape conviction was overturned because the justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans she must have helped her rapist remove her jeans, thereby implying consent (peaceoverviolence. org). On this day, allies of the cause are encouraged to wear denim to show their support. SASC teamed up with TCBY (Shorewood) and The Great American Bagel (Joliet) who helped with promoting this movement.

The month of awareness activities concluded with "Walk a Mile" held at the Joliet Public Library, downtown location, on April 27th. The event featured a rally, survivor speaker, raffles and awareness activities followed by attendees participating in a mile-long march around the area sidewalks to bring attention to sexual assault & gender-based violence. 125 Year Anniversary of Guardian Angel Community Services

On October 19, 2022 Guardian Angel Community Services celebrated its 125-year anniversary! We reflected on this historic milestone and Guardian Ángel's time-honored history of when the Sisters of St. Francis Mary Immaculate purchased a small cottage behind their Motherhouse that became the first Guardian Angel Home on October 19, 1897. To commemorate this monumental achievement, Assistant Majority Leader for the House Democratic Caucus and State Representative Natalie Manley presented a House Resolution, which included the organization's storied history and achievements. Since the start of the 21st century, Guardian Angel Community Services has served over 700,000 people through direct services, prevention education, and community outreach, expanding its services by an extraordinary 705%. Guardian Angel Community Services has an exemplary history of adapting programming in

response to community needs, including opening satellite offices in Joliet, Plainfield, Morris, and Crete, and expanding emergency shelter beds for survivors of domestic violence by 50%; more recently, the organization responded swiftly to the global COVID-19 pandemic, with its heroic staff serving on the front lines to deliver 24-hour essential services. Guardian Angel Community Services continues to withstand the test of time while demonstrating community leadership and service towards significantly improving the quality of life of citizens." Additionally, the agency was humbled to have all of these achievements further recognized by the Illinois State Senate and Senator Meg Loughran Cappel, and United States Senators Dick Durbin and Tammy Duckworth.
