



### It is our pleasure to share our FY 2024 Annual Report, recapping the fiscal year of July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. Guardian Angel's annual report represents the collaborative efforts of our staff, administration, Board of Directors, and all of you, who help us to help those who need it most. We have been a safe

haven for individuals and families in crisis since 1897, helping thousands of sexual assault and domestic violence survivors and abused children. During 2024, our phenomenal staff reached an astounding 161,195 people, 16,498 through direct services, across six programs, and 144,697 via prevention education and community outreach. All of our emergency essential services were implemented 24 hours daily, seven days a week. We provided 11,078 nights of emergency shelter and 33,234 meals to adults and children fleeing the horrors of domestic violence. Additionally, 9,137 emergency hotline calls were fielded out of our 24-hour emergency shelter. This was an extra special year for me, personally, as I celebrated my 25 Year Anniversary with Guardian Angel Community Services, a tremendous honor, indeed! We were also proud to be recognized by Lewis University with the prestigious De La Salle Medallion for Excellence in Community Partnership Award, presented to our Sexual Assault Services Center. We were commended for demonstrating outstanding collaboration through curricular and co-curricular community engagement, creating transformational student learning



experiences, and contributing meaningfully to the greater community. We also hosted the Council on Accreditation, following a year and a half of intensive preparations, for a multi-tiered site visit that ended in high praise and reaccreditation. We celebrated our 16th Annual Angelica: Dancing With Our Local Stars Gala that was held on April 6, 2024. The event drew in more than 550 in attendance and raised crucial funds for the agency. Additionally, memorable awareness activities were hosted throughout April and October for Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
