Dear Friends,

It is my pleasure to share Guardian Angel's 2025 Newsletter, as we reflect on a wonderful year of service and celebration. Our phenomenal staff reached 161,195 people, 16,498 through direct services, across six programs, and 144,697 through trainings and presentations. Our essential services were implemented 24-hours daily, seven days a week. We provided 11,078 nights of emergency shelter and 33,234 meals to adults and children fleeing the horrors of domestic violence. Additionally, 9,137 emergency hotline calls were fielded out of our 24-hour emergency shelter. We advanced our mission to provide diverse services that inspire people to improve the quality of their lives in their greatest time of need. This was an extra special year for me, personally, as I celebrated my 25 Year Anniversary with Guardian Angel Community



Services, a tremendous honor, indeed! We also hosted the Council on Accreditation, following a year and a half of intensive preparations, for a multi-tiered site visit that ended in high praise and reaccreditation. We celebrated our mission at our 16th Annual Angelica: Dancing With Our Local Stars Gala with 550 guests and raised crucial funds for the agency. Additionally, memorable awareness activities were hosted throughout April and October for Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Awareness Month. We hope you enjoy reading about the exciting achievements of the last year. On behalf of our Board of Directors, staff, volunteers, and everyone at Guardian Angel Community Services, thank you for your support.

## Groundwork Domestic Violence Program & Suzy's Caring Place celebrate Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM)

Every year during October: Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM), GACS participates in many awareness events and activities. October 2024 was another memorable year for our Groundwork Domestic Violence Program and Suzy's Caring Place - Transitional Living Program. We had a successful awareness month, hosting and participating in a variety of events!

This past fall, we kicked off the month of October with the 14th Annual Angels Against Abuse 5K Walk & Run held on October 5, 2024. The annual 5K was held at a new location, Lewis University, long-time partner and supporter of Guardian Angel. A keynote speech and survival story was shared by Illinois State Senator, Rachel Ventura. Employees of long-time agency supporters, Chicago Tube and Iron attended the event in large numbers including Chairman and CEO Dr. Donald McNeeley and his family. Additional funds were raised through raffle baskets, ticket sales, and generous donations from our community supporters.

Witches Night Out is a costume fundraiser for women who want to make a difference in another woman's life. Proceeds go to Will County Agencies serving women and children. The agencies selected provide services and support that help women secure their independence, regain their dignity, and become self-sufficient (www.witchesnightout.com). The event is held annually at the Jacob Henry Mansion (Joliet) and has continued to grow in popularity, year after year, with tickets selling out in record time. Additionally, Guardian Angel staff serve on the committee and volunteer every year as the "gatekeepers" and scan thousands of tickets for attendees, as they arrive. GACS was so thankful to, again, have been selected as a recipient of proceeds from the event.

Grundy County Take Back the Night (TBTN) was hosted on October 23, 2024 in Morris, Illinois where the agency operates a satellite office. Grundy TBTN is a free event, organized by our Groundwork Program and held annually at the Grundy County Court House. This year's event included a keynote survivor speaker in association with the Morris Women's Club. The event concluded with a "March for Awareness" walk to the Grundy County Historical Museum where it concluded. Grundy TBTN would not be possible without assistance provided by the Morris Women's Club throughout the years.

The 25th annual Will County Take Back the Night (TBTN) event took place October 24, 2024 at Crossroads Church in Joliet. The event was free to the public and included resource tables, a vigil honoring lives lost to domestic violence in Will county, and a march in the surrounding area. Annually, TBTN brings survivors, supporters, activists and community leaders together in a call to end violence. The 2024 event featured speaker Mary Jo Claffy, who shared the story of her son, Mitch, who lost his life in an abusive, same-sex relationship in April of 2022 at the age of 31. #### Foster Care Celebrates National Foster Care Month

Our Foster Care Program celebrated the month of May: National Foster Care Month. In preparation, the foster care program held a contest where foster care youth were invited to submit a design to be used on apparel in order to promote and spread awareness. Once all applications were submitted, the Foster Care program staff voted on a winning design to be used on apparel that was sold in preparation for May 2025. The contest, and subsequent apparel fundraiser held through Custom Ink, helped the program raise more that \$1,000. In addition, the program participated in outreach events including social media where they shared success stories, encouraged followers to get the word out in order to reach their goal of 5 new foster home applications in the month of May, and put a spotlight on Foster Parents at Guardian Angel Community Services: Foster Parents Jasmine and Chris, who have been with Guardian Angel since 2023, have welcomed 24 children into their home, assisted with 6 Long-Term placements, and have taken in 18 children who were in need of emergency placement. Jasmine and Chris continually answer the call to provide a safe and loving home to Youth in Care- whether it be for one night, one week, one month, or one year. The Foster Care Program is so grateful for the countless individuals and families who supported their efforts during the awareness month of May, and of course for all of those who champion their cause, year-round.

### Recap of April: Sexual Assault Awareness Month

April, recognized nationally as Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM), was highlighted by many exciting awareness events and activities hosted by our Sexual Assault Service Center (SASC). 2025 was a year to remember! A music-themed event, "Songs for Survivors" was held on April 25, 2025 at Pelican Harry's Bar & Grill in Homer Glen. The event featured music by the talented Full Circle Acoustic duo, comprised of former SASC staff member Janice Masokas and husband, Mike. The second half of the evening featured Saul Good Trio, who generously donated their time to perform at the event. Funds were raised through a split the pot and raffle benefitting survivors of sexual assault. The annual "Walk a Mile" awareness event was held at the Joliet Public Library,

downtown location, on April 30, 2025. The event featured a rally, an educational presentation given

by staff, including a survivor story that was shared anonymously, raffles and awareness activities followed by attendees participating in a mile-long march to bring attention to sexual assault & gender-based violence. The program was grateful for Harrah's Casino Joliet volunteers who assisted with this event, as they have for many years! This month, Denim Day was celebrated in conjunction with Walk a Mile-on April 30, 2025. For the past 25 years, Peace Over Violence has run its Denim Day campaign on a Wednesday in April in honor of Sexual Violence Awareness Month. The campaign was originally triggered by a ruling by the Italian Supreme Court where a rape conviction was overturned because the justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans she must have helped her perpetrator remove them, thereby implying consent (peaceoverviolence.org). On this day, allies of the cause are encouraged to wear denim to show their support. ### Partner Abuse Intervention Program (PAIP) at GACS

This past year has been one of many successes and milestones for our Partner Abuse Intervention Program (PAIP). The PAIP program, established in 2010, provides perpetrators of domestic violence with appropriate and effective services

so they will recognize and accept accountability for their actions, while maintaining a focus on victim safety. Education is provided to individuals who cause harm in order to reduce and prevent domestic violence. In very exciting news, as of March 2025, our PAIP personnel now have a space in the Criminal Felony and Misdemeanor Domestic Violence Call space at the Will County Courthouse. The PAIP Program has also shared the following success stories:

Family Reunification: Both fathers and mothers participating in the program have made substantial progress, with some regaining custody of their children through the DCFS court system. Their dedication to change has had a direct and positive impact on their families.

Employment Milestones: Two program participants recently secured union jobs, enhancing their ability to support themselves and their families with stability and long-term opportunities.

From Homelessness to Stability: One gentleman entered the program while living in a shelter and unemployed. Through consistent effort and engagement with PAIP, he successfully graduated, having secured both permanent housing and gainful employment.

These stories are a testament to the transformative power of intervention, accountability, and support. We celebrate the resilience and progress of our participants as they work toward building safer, healthier futures.
